## *Malta Session III – July 3–7, 2017*

### **SIGNIFICANT SUPREME COURT CASES: 2016 TERM IN REVIEW**

*United States Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg*

Join United States Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg in Malta as she shares a retrospective on select cases from the term ending June 2017. This one-credit course will also include a question and answer session with Justice Ginsburg, and an informal gathering with Malta program participants.

In faculty-led sessions, students will delve into select cases from the term, including oral arguments presented and briefs filed. This course is graded pass/fail.

Tuition for the one-credit course is \$750 and participation is limited to students who enroll in at least one other session in the Malta program. Dates for the 2017 Malta program are:

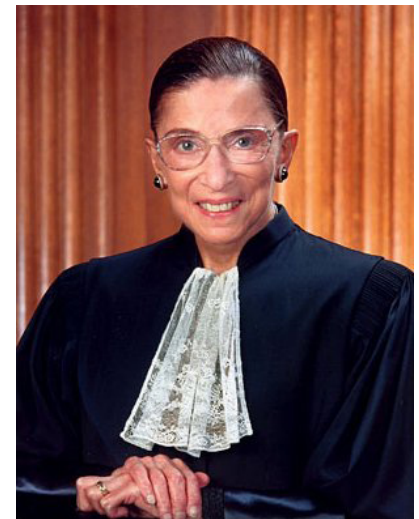
- Session I only – May 19 – June 15, 2017 (4 credits)
- Session II – June 19 – 30, 2017 (2 credits)
- Session III – July 3 – 7, 2017 (1 credit - must also enroll in either or both Sessions I & II)

Students may enroll in the following sessions/combinations in Malta:

- Session I only – May 19 – June 15, 2017 (4 credits, tuition \$3000)
- Sessions I and II – May 19 – June 30, 2017 (6 credits, tuition \$4500)
- Sessions II and III – June 19 – July 7 (3 credits, tuition \$2250)
- Sessions I and III – May 19 – June 15 and July 3 – 7, 2017 (5 credits, tuition \$3750)
- Sessions I, II, III – May 19 – July 7, 2017 (7 credits, tuition \$5,250)

#### **FACULTY BIOGRAPHY**

**Ruth Bader Ginsburg**, Associate Justice, was born in Brooklyn, New York, March 15, 1933. She married Martin D. Ginsburg in 1954, and has a daughter, Jane, and a son, James. She received her B.A. from Cornell University, attended Harvard Law School, and received her LL.B. from Columbia Law School. She served as a law clerk to the Honorable Edmund L. Palmieri, Judge of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, from 1959–1961. From 1961–1963, she was a research associate and then associate director of the Columbia Law School Project on International Procedure. She was a Professor of Law at Rutgers University School of Law from 1963–1972, and Columbia Law School from 1972–1980, and a fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences in Stanford, California from 1977–1978. In 1971, she was instrumental in launching the Women’s Rights Project of the American Civil Liberties Union, and served as the ACLU’s General Counsel from 1973–1980, and on the National Board of Directors from 1974–1980. She was appointed a Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit in 1980. President Clinton nominated her as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, and she took her seat August 10, 1993.
