

KEVIN YAMAMOTO, Professor of Law at South Texas College of Law Houston, teaches all levels of income, estate, and corporate tax. He is the co-author of a number of books, including the law student's staple *Black Letter on Federal Income Taxation* and the *Black Letter on Federal Wealth Transfer Taxes* published by West. Professor Yamamoto has taught a variety of tax-related courses as a visiting professor at the University of Florida (1995-96), University of Montana (2007), University of San Diego (2002) and Chapman University (2002-03) schools of law. He has also taught courses in law school summer programs in the Czech Republic and Cambridge, England. Before teaching, he practiced law in San Diego and clerked for U.S. District Court Judge Irving Hill of the Central District of California. He earned his LL.M. in Taxation from the University of Florida, and J.D. from the University of San Diego. Professor Yamamoto will teach *Comparative Taxation I* and *Comparative Taxation II* and will serve as the program director in both Session One and Session Two.
