Tabrez Y. Ebrahim. Professor of Law at California Western School of Law teaches and writes in the areas of patent law, entrepreneurship, and innovation. His research explores emerging technologies and centers on the intersection of law and business. Prior to entering the legal academy, Professor Ebrahim's professional roles focused on invention and innovation and he earned graduate degrees in each of engineering (M.S.), business (M.B.A.), and law (J.D., LL.M.). His interdisciplinary scholarship draws on his career experiences as a R&D engineer, a technology transfer and incubator director, a startup founder and entrepreneur, a corporate venture capital manager, and an attorney. He is an inventor on a U.S. patent and patent application, and is licensed to practice in Texas and before the U.S. Patent & Trademark Office. Before starting at California Western, Professor Ebrahim was an attorney in patent prosecution and technology transactions practice groups at a Texas law firm and a Visiting Research Fellow at Bournemouth University's Centre for Intellectual Property Policy & Management in England.
