# Prague, Czech Republic | May 26 – June 23, 2023

From its eclectic mix of architectural styles spanning several centuries, Prague offers some of Europe's most beautiful sights. In addition to studying international and comparative law, take time to visit the largest ancient castle in the world, stroll across the historic Charles Bridge into Old Town Square and see the medieval Astronomical Clock, soaking in sights all along the way. Several long weekends allow for exploring the region.

## COURSES AND FACULTY

### Session: May 26 – June 23

Choose two courses for four credits

- **Religious Freedom: International and Comparative Law Perspective** (2 credits)

Professor John J. Worley, South Texas College of Law Houston

This course examines the relationship between law and religion from an international and comparative law perspective. We will study a series of religious controversies where

rights claimed by individuals, religious groups, and the state conflict. In doing so, we will consider how governments have weighed individual rights against collective rights and have sought to balance religious freedom against other social and legal values, rights, and needs.

- **International Arbitration in the Real World** (2 credits)

Associate Dean And Professor, Cherie O. Taylor, South Texas College of Law Houston

This course examines how international arbitration agreements are negotiated and drafted, how the arbitral process operates, and how arbitral awards are enforced under the New York Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards. International arbitration is the form of dispute resolution used for deciding international business transactions (sale of goods, licensing of intellectual property rights, foreign direct investment), protecting of investor rights under Bilateral Investment Treaties, and resolving controversies in international organizations (World Trade Organization, Court of Arbitration for Sports).

- **Global Lawyering** (2 credits)

Professor Katerina Lewinbuk, South Texas College of Law Houston

This course is intended to expose students to the various types of regulation of lawyers in different parts of the world. It will comparatively examine the structure and ethical framework of the legal profession in the United States, European Union and in a few selected countries. More specifically, it is a collaborative research seminar that is designed to foster in-depth study of legal issues related to comparative global lawyering.

**Admission is open to any law student at an ABA-accredited law school who is in good academic standing and who has completed the first year of full-time study or its equivalent in part-time study.**

1. Submit an online application for admission
2. Pay the \$200 non-refundable application fee online
3. For non-STCL Houston students, submit a letter of good standing from his or her law school stating that the student is in good academic standing and that credits earned in this program will transfer toward his or her J.D.

An application is not complete without these items. Applications will be accepted on a first-come basis and enrollment is limited, so early application is encouraged.

All fees/costs are in U.S. dollars. These fees do not include transportation, lodging, sightseeing, meals, insurance, books, supplies or other materials for the program. Costs, other than tuition and items specifically designated in this brochure as included, are the sole responsibility of the student.
